Remote Supervision Continuing Education Course AVAILABLE ONLINE SOON!

VDHA is pleased to generously offer the "Remote Supervision: Guidelines for Practice" CE course FREE OF **CHARGE** to members and potential members for a **three month period**. There will be a nominal charge to take the course after the initial three month period. Please watch your inbox for an email announcing the online availability of this course beginning sometime in May; and check our website for more information: https://vdha.wildapricot.org/.

This course meets the criteria set forth by the Virginia Board of Dentistry requiring a minimum of two hours of continuing education by a licensed dental hygienist wishing to practice under the remote supervision of a dentist. (18VAC60-25-190 Requirements for continuing education.)

Resources will also be available to support hygienists wishing to practice under remote supervision in a variety of settings as specified in the new law. These online materials will be available for purchase beginning in the fall.

As your professional organization, VDHA advocates continued competence, lifelong learning and ongoing professional development for licensed hygienists in Virginia. This is just one of the many benefits that you can help to support with your VDHA membership.

2018-2019 Alice Hinchcliffe Williams, RDH, MS Merit Scholarship



The VDHA Foundation (VDHAF) is delighted to announce and introduce recipient, Jamie Knupp, RDH, BSDH

Jamie graduated with a Bachelor of Science in Biology from Bridgewater College in 2011 and a Bachelor of Science in Dental Hygiene from Old Dominion University in 2014. Currently, she is pursuing a Master of Science in Dental Hygiene from ODU with an anticipated graduation date of May 2019.

"My research focuses on the interprofessional collaboration between school nurses and registered dental hygienists to reduce plaque scores in elementary school aged children. While enrolled in the undergraduate program at Old Dominion University, I decided to pursue the opportunity to earn a Master's Degree in Dental Hygiene. I wanted to create opportunities for myself later in life as a result of gaining knowledge outside of the traditional realm as a registered dental hygienist. I currently enjoy providing quality, evidence-based care to my patients working five days a week in two different private practice settings. I am in the early stages of setting up an internship to create an interprofessional collaboration between school nurses and dental hygienists in Rockingham County, VA, to try and promote good oral hygiene in a population that would otherwise not receive the necessary education. My goal is to promote awareness in elementary school aged children and help to increase knowledge of proper home care. Just as Ms. Alice Hinchcliffe Williams, enjoyed working in the school systems, the Alice Hinchcliffe Williams, RDH, MS Merit Scholarship would help me to reach my goal of accessing a population that does not always have the means to frequent a private practice office for dental hygiene services."

Alice Hinchcliffe Williams, RDH, MS Merit Scholarship for Post Licensure or Graduate Degree Funded by the Virginia Dental Hygienists' Association Foundation and administered by the ADHA Institute for Oral Health (IOH), this scholarship was created to honor Alice Hinchcliffe Williams, RDH, MS—our deceased colleague and benefactor who enabled the establishment of the VDHA Foundation. The Alice Hinchcliffe Williams, RDH, MS Graduate Scholarship provides financial assistance to part-time or full-time students residing in Virginia who are pursuing a baccalaureate or graduate degree in Dental Hygiene or in accredited studies related to the professional roles of the Dental Hygienist. While the applicant must possess an active DH license and Virginia residency, the degree seeking endeavor does not require the applicant to attend school within Virginia. The award amount for this scholarship is \$1500.

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Alice Hinchcliffe Williams Scholarship

The AHW Scholarship is to be awarded each year in the amount of \$500 to a student in the first/Junior year of the fall semester in a Virginia dental hygiene program. Those Virginia dental hygiene students with at least a 2.5 GPA (4.00 Scale) are eligible for this scholarship. Each applicant must be a member of an ADHA Student Chapter and must have demonstrated qualities for success in the dental hygiene program.

The winner of this year's scholarship is Erika Lauren Serrano from Thomas Nelson Community College. I would like to thank our judges Moe Thompson, Maureen McCann and Melanie Bartlam for their help, there were many good essays submitted and it was a tough decision. Congratulations Erika!

The following is a copy of her essay:

"It is my belief that to be great at your career, it isn't enough to just "do" your job. Instead, using your creative mind to ripple your passion into talents that will reach a larger audience is doing so much more. Sharing my journey through writing and educating others is what I plan to contribute to the Dental Hygiene world after graduation.

My creative tool is writing. I have a connection with using words to reach the public, opening their theoretical eyes by allowing them to read a deja entendu fact in a new light. It may not be effective to play a record for each patient every day of "Brush your teeth. Floss. Come back in 6 months." Nor is it an effective record for the professionals in the industry.

I plan to be a well published writer in many public and professional dental hygiene editorials. This is a goal I am confident in obtaining because it is something I have accomplished in my current field of Esthetics. My most recent publication was in Skin Inc. and is about infection control, inspired by my time in the dental hygiene program. My goal in that publication was to spread blood borne pathogen awareness to Spa professionals and I believe I have accomplished that. I have similar goals in the dental hygiene field.

I plan to revive topics such as infection control, stress management, and passion rejuvenation. I feel I have seen too many negative expressions in print when I research the dental hygiene career and education process. I feel this can be deterring to potential hygiene students and new hygienists. It is a statistical fact that one will remember the negative things they read much more than the positive. I believe I have the ability to be a remembered positive article that trumps the negative.

To do this, one must reach their audience in a new light, catering to their differences, keeping up with the times of fast paced intake of information and regurgitation. I want my audience, patients, co workers and readers, to feel understood and in a safe place to absorb new information, as if it was their choice to learn it, not being force fed it.

Even more, inspiring fellow hygienists through my writing in the hopes of reigniting their passion and minds will further my contribution. I believe all it takes is one positive person to change a crowd's attitude and with that, I'll make an impact."


Thomas Nelson Community College
