President's Final Message

How many times in your career have you been asked the questions; "What made you decide to become a dental hygienist?" or "Do you ever get bored doing the same thing all the time?"



In the 70's when I was trying to decide on a career path, I asked the "girls" at my orthodontist's office about their jobs because they always seemed to enjoy what they were doing. Each of the assistants encouraged me to work a little harder, get a formal education and become a hygienist. I loved the idea of working with people, was kind of a science nerd, was interested in health care, and the hours were better than nurses. I have been practicing for 30 years now and still do not get bored because I believe strongly in continuing education, community and professional involvement, and

seeking out opportunities to make a difference.

The mission statement of the Virginia Dental Hygienists' Association is "Oral health professionals promoting total health." What an exciting concept. We as dental hygienists have the opportunity each day to assist our patients in making choices that improve their oral health, which could ultimately save their lives! We discuss tobacco cessation, nutrition, perform blood pressure and oral cancer exams, educate our clients about medications, oral and systemic diseases and methods of prevention.

The ADHA represents the professional interests of dental hygienists across the United States. According to the ADHA data base, there are over 120,000 licensed dental hygienists registered in the United States. The U.S. government statistics indicate that between 2000 and 2010, the number of licensed dental hygienists will increase 43%. There are more than 265 nationally accredited dental hygiene educational programs in the nation and that number is growing.

Dental Hygiene is not just a job; it is a career, a profession that is constantly changing in order to better serve the public's needs. Unity as a profession was evidenced this year when the Board of Dentistry pursued expanding the dental assistant scope of practice to include scaling teeth without formal education, training, licensing, or regulation by a health board. The legislative committee and executive board members met numerous times and spent countless hours with our legal counsel developing strategy to help prevent this from becoming a reality. Many of you responded with letters to the board and also to your legislators explaining the importance of a college education and legal accountability.

VDHA leaders worked diligently last year to promote legislation allowing hygienists to administer local anesthesia and nitrous oxide in Virginia. I had the opportunity to serve on a task force with other VDHA members and also members of the VDAA and VDA developing this advance in our scope of practice. Hundreds of hygienists attended the introductory course on local anesthesia VDHA provided at the 54th Annual Session. The next several months will serve as the final

Legislative Update

<u>***</u>

Local Anesthesia/nitrous oxide:

The following is the *proposed* regulation for adoption:

36 didactic and clinical hours and must successfully complete an examination with a minimum score of 75% at a School of Dental Hygiene or a Dental School.

A dental hygienist who holds a certificate or credential issued by the licensing board of another U.S. jurisdiction that authorizes the administration of nitrous oxide/inhalation analgesia or local anesthesia may be authorized in Virginia if their credential or certificate is *substantially equivalent* to Virginia's hours and course content. If the certificate or credential is not substantially equivalent then the hygienist can document experience in such administration for at least 24 of the past 48 months preceding application for licensure in Virginia.

It will be up to the dentist and the dental hygienist (not the Board of Dentistry) to ensure that the education and training meet the requirements and both licensees can be subject to sanctions. Again the BOD proposes this for adoption and until then, the dental hygienists cannot administer anesthesia or nitrous oxide. This proposal will be available for public comments in the near future and we will let everyone know how to view and comment. The Board said it could take until 2008 before the adoption is complete.

Dental Assistant I & II:

The Regulatory Legislative Committee has decided to table this matter for now and hopes to come up with a better proposal that all parties concerned can agree on.

Informed Consent NOIRA.

The Board will issue a NOIRA to add informed consent to the record keeping requirements in regulation section 18VAC60-20-15.

Question on use of Lasers by Dental Hygienists.

The Board advised that such duty *couldn't be delegated* to dental hygienists under regulation 18VAC60-20-200.

Give Kids a (Big) Smile Day


On February 2, 2007, 954 Richmond area children hon, Terry Muessig, and Beth Robinson. were seen through the Give Kids A Smile® Day held at the Boys & Girls Clubs of Metro Richmond Central Unit. The children served ranged in age from 7 months to 18 years. All children received a dental exam and most a "toothbrush prophy" and fluoride varnish. Through the dental exams provided, 337 children were found to need follow-up care (268 with one to four cavities and 69 with five or more cavities).
