#### A word about VHY-PAC and you...

What is it and why is it vital to the Virginia Dental Hygienists' Association? It is a voluntary, non-profit committee of dental hygienists that are not affiliated with any particular political party. How does the VDHA form this committee? Our house of delegates votes for two people to become directors for two years and two people to serve a one year term. At the first executive board meeting the new VDHA president appoints two people who are ratified by the executive board. We have several fund raisers annually. Our lobbyist helps us to investigate fund raisers, dinners, etc. where we can contribute from the funds that we raise to politicians who are friends of the dental hygiene profession. These politicians may help us by supporting or opposing a bill or a regulatory change that may or may not serve our profession well.

The fund-raiser at our Annual Session that you all have helped so much with is the silent auction baskets. Each component in the state is responsible for bringing in a basket and they are wonderful. We sell pins and jewelry at the basket table. We "roast our outgoing president" at the president's banquet at Annual Session and take up a collection for VHY-PAC. All of these are wonderful ways of raising funds, but lobbyist is always quick to let us know that we can never have enough to "help our voice to be heard".

So, I guess you are now wondering what can I do to help, right? We can accept your contribution at any time during the year, not just at Annual Session.
