## President's Message

Greetings fellow members of the Virginia Dental Hygienists' Association,

While attending the ADHA meeting, I had the privilege to serve on a Reference Committee to the House of Delegates. This was a wonderful learning experience and gave me the chance to network with other colleagues from across the nation. I am extremely grateful to the members of VDHA for allowing me to represent Virginia at this wonderful meeting.

As the fall approaches, the profession of dental hygiene in Virginia faces new challenges and opportunities. Soon, we will have the addition of the DA II, which is the expanded function dental assistant. Besides the DA II, the Virginia Board of Dentistry has scheduled a review of the rules and regulations that affect the practice of dentistry and dental hygiene. A Notice of Intended Regulatory Action, or NOIRA, has been issued. The comment period for the NOIRA will end on September 30, 2010. You can be sure that VDHA will voice our opinions to ensure that the public as well as our profession are protected. However, *we cannot do this alone*! Please contact the Governmental and Professional Affairs Council Chair, Pam Kitner, or the Regulation and Practice Committee Chair, Carrie Simpson, on how *YOU* can make a difference.

In addition to the aforementioned, VDHA is investigating Medicaid reimbursement for dental hygienists, pursuing answers to the access to care issue, and examining the various workforce models that are currently in existence. Although the upcoming overhaul of the rules and regulations can be viewed as a challenge, it can be a wonderful opportunity to achieve more for the profession of dental hygiene.

Remember, if we *Dream* it, *Believe* it, then we can *Achieve* it.

# NOTICE OF INTENDED REGULATORY ACTION (NOIRA)

Notice is herby given that the Virginia Board of Dentistry (BOD) intends to consider amending regulations created for the practice of dentists, dental hygienists and dental assistants. As a result of a lengthy periodic review, the BOD has determined that Chapter 20 of the Virginia Board of Dentistry Regulations be reorganized with new chapters that will detail the duties allowed for these positions. This process could take more than two full years to complete but will be one of the best opportunities for Virginia dental hygienists to work towards and achieve many of our goals that protect our profession and the citizens of the Commonwealth. The Regulation and Legislation Committee of the BOD did a preliminary review and they intend to have approximately four new chapters added that will include updates on dentistry, dental hygiene, dental assistants and another for other items of concern.

The new regulations for Dental Assistant II (DAII) are in the office of the secretary for Governor MacDonnell for review of final publication. The language the BOD adopted for the final regulations reads that a dentist may utilize up to a total of four dental hygienists OR four dental assistants II in any combination practicing under direction or general supervision at one and the same time, with the exception that a dentist may issue written orders for services to be provided by dental hygienists under general supervision in a free clinic, a public health program, or on a voluntary basis. *AT THIS TIME*, supragingival scaling is NOT allowed by DA II's, but VDHA is concerned that the BOD still finds it necessary to limit the number of dental hygienists that may practice in one office.

There will be a series of public comment periods in which the Virginia Dental Hygienists' Association (VDHA) will be able to voice the questions and concerns of the dental hygiene profession. *We need your voice!* This is a concern for *ALL* registered dental hygienists of Virginia and a time when we need to join together and be active in promoting our professional skills to increase access to care for all populations and to be protective of the kind of care they receive. # Giving Back

## Old Dominion Professor and Student Join Dental Mission to Nicaragua

Gayle McCombs, professor at Old Dominion University (ODU) and MSDH graduate student Kendra Kleppe accompanied a dental team to Nicaragua as part of a dental mission conducted by Physicians for Peace. As part of their assignment McCombs and Kleppe worked to provide oral health assessments, dental treatment, and education to multiple age groups from the community.

Old Dominion University is partnering with Physicians or Peace and University of Nicaragua-León Dental School (UNLD) to help establish the first dental hygiene program in Central America. On behaf of ODU McCombs and Kleppe conducted a needs assessment, explored the dental school campus, and met with the dean and faculty of the dental school to discuss how to bring dental hygiene education to Nicaragua. Discussion included outlining a plan for ODU to assist in developing a program that would train future dental hygiene faculty at UNLD as a way to sustain long-term education and skill training. The plan aims to create access to care and expand opportunity for the people of Nicaragua.

#### **Hygienists without Borders- Ghana Team 2010**

NVCC Dental Hygiene Students visit Ghana, Africa on a Global Community Outreach Project

Director of NVCC Dental Clinic & Dental Hygiene Team Leader-Howard L. Kelley DDS, MPH; NVCC faculty Mrs. Suzanne Shaw, RDH and Voncile English Kelley RN, MED; Daria U. Amato, MSN, RN, CNE Associate Professor of NVCC Nursing program piloted an International Studies class this summer that culminated in a 2 week trip, providing required dental treatment and oral health education to the impoverished indigenous population of Ghana, Africa.

The dental hygiene students that participated in this project are: class of 2010 graduates Punita Mangat Fielding RDH and Jennifer Miller RDH; along with Dana Hampel, Constance Rice and Abby White-second year dental hygiene students from the Class of 2011. The team provided oral health education, dental screenings, perio-debridements, prophylaxis and simple dental surgeries. They worked in an existing government hospital dental clinic in the town of *Half Assini*, and turned an empty room at the Solam Gospel Clinic in *Bonyere* into a temporary dental clinic. The pioneer dental team and allied health professionals of nine were able to deliver care to over 300 patients of all ages during the time spent in the two clinics. In addition, the Ghana Team from NVCC had a rewarding opportunity to visit the Word Alive Orphanage and Children's Home in the village of Esiama; where dental education and dental screenings were performed on 32 wonderful children ranging from 5-17 years of age. NVCC Ghana team feels extremely fortunate to have had this opportunity to make a difference in the world. The experience led to treating the needed as well as developing cultural awareness and learning which has forever altered their lives. The need for global dental care is so great that programs such as this cannot be underestimated. The NVCC

Ghana team of 2010 fervently hopes that the International Studies class can continue in order to make future dental projects to Ghana and other countries possible again.
