October 18 at 6:30pm Ken Marinak, DDS will be our guest presenter. Look for updates on Facebook for further information.



# **VHyPAC News**



#### **Remote Supervision Update**

Just a reminder that the "Remote Supervision: Guidelines for Practice" CE course is currently available FREE OF CHARGE to members and potential members until September 30. #### **Advocacy Update**

- There are now 4 states that have dental therapy- Minnesota, Maine, Vermont and Arizona.
- Federal Trade Commission speaker touched on some specific wage issue questions such as: clocking out if patient does not show up- if employer asks you to remain in the office, you should still be paid for your time, if you are free to leave the office, you would not be paid for your time
- What is ADHA doing for me?
  - o Dental hygiene standards- seeking to bring back dental hygiene diagnosis back in CODA standards, as it was removed 10 years ago.
  - o Adding new definitions for inter-professional education and dental hygiene process of care.
  - Working with ADA and ADEA to form a "Coalition for Dental Licensure Reform/Coalition.
     One of the goals is to eliminate the single encounter, patient-based procedure from the clinical licensure examination process.
  - Other states are working on obtain the ability to provide local anesthesia, direct access and expanded functionality.
- Amanda Apple, Indiana Legislative Chair
  - o "Essential primary care providers" is the term they are using.
  - o Steps for talking with legislators
    - Start big
    - Spoon-feed them- what would your ideal situation look like and answer every why not question.
    - Be transparent (this is what we want, open to revision, make them think it was their idea)
    - Show them the facts to explain why you need it (stakeholders and legislators)
    - Make those key partnerships: Lobbyist, PAC, legislators, ADHA, coalitions
  - o Future ideas: teledentistry, interprofessional relationships, increased scope of practice, direct reimbursement and prescriptive authority (fluorides)
- Dental hygiene licensure
  - Ourrent model is state controlled for what they accept. There are no real standards- all regional board exams claim they do the same thing yet not all states accept all board exams. This makes it difficult for dental hygienists who work along borders when one state has a certain scope of practice and in another state does not (i.e. Work in VA and can provide local anesthesia, but work in NC and cannot provide this service.)
- Elimination of single patient procedure based encounter
  - ADEA created the DH Clinical Licensure Survey in Spring 2016 with 86% response rate of 266 program directors.
  - Top 3 concerns: 1) Students have difficult time finding patients that met specific criteria and students will go to extended lengths for the one moment in time; 2) Ethical concerns raised re the way patients are recruited; when patients only received treatment for the quadrant and have no follow up; students pay patients to sit for exam and then patients cancelling on the day of exam unless student pays them more money for their time; 3) Students were personally transporting equipment and patients to different testing sites and states. Then they would bring back dirty equipment back home in their cars and let it sit over the weekend because they did not have access to school's sterilization

#### Mega Issue Discussions

- Top challenges affecting the dental hygiene profession
  - o Focus on patient care to a "profit/production."
  - o Workforce retirement-not enough hygienists for temporary work or to fill full time positions.
  - Insurance reimbursement
- Top challenges affecting state association
  - o Member retention-dealing with current members with bad connections and unwillingness to change. Encouraged to stay current and visible on all technology arenas.
  - o Competition- study clubs and dental peeps.
- 3 things the ADHA state leaders should consider doing differently
  - o Rethink state visits with trustee to keep transparency
  - More leadership/mentorship workshop/programs
  - o Gives states more social media talking points to dispense to grass roots and student members

#### Constituent & Component Leadership Workshop

- Hosting Legislator breakfast, inviting spouses as well as members/potential members.
- People don't want to own but want access to contacts, CE, resources.
- How many small jobs do you offer?
- Micro events include packages for homeless, stuff bags for legislators.
- Create blog post.
- Panel of retired, new grad and middle of career hygienists.
- 3 points of contact for potential members- check in, show to room, sit them with someone special just like at work (person, resource and activity)
- Create special interest groups within component
- Get social-use pictures, make a hash tag, board members should be profile picture, use children for posts to make it relatable, use holidays as a good way to connect to members.
- Community service projects- DC dental hygiene association did this.

<u>CODA Hearing</u>- the biggest issue of concern is the proposed elimination of the "single patient experience procedure based encounter". This was a Proposed Resolution that passed in the HOD as well.

10 State Initiative Focus Group- Emily Ludwig, Mimi Magyar

- Each of the 10 states included in the initiative were asked to complete a survey before the workgroup at Annual Session to give feedback on how the initiative went in their state.
- Representatives from each state were able to talk about how it went in their state and what did and didn't work in obtaining new members.
- It seemed that having more time at events was more helpful in obtaining more members.
- It was helpful to have ADHA staff and leaders at the membership initiative events.
- More time to plan the events and pick the event where the initiative was held would have been more helpful in some states.
- There was some focus work about what states need from ADHA to be more successful in obtaining and retaining new members.
- Several states thought tool kits for leadership and more Zoom meetings related to training in leadership positions would be helpful.
- A way for states to meet or network together frequently to talk about what is working in their states for membership.
- There was talk about more membership initiatives in the future, possibly at even the component level to help with membership.


